### Shepherd University Safety Survey 2010 Comments

1. Martin Hall - In reference to questions 7 and 8 - Are these provided by Facilities?
2. Knutti Hall - During the recent construction, fumes from paint, glues and solvents have contributed to an unpleasant (and possibly unsafe) learning environment. Scaffolds, ladders and drop cloths created hazards especially when large numbers of students were in hallways. Dust from drywall and ceiling installation was not cleaned up (except that floors were vacuumed) and covered all desk, chair and shelf surfaces. This work should not have been done during one of the busiest times of the academic year. (2)

4. There should be a crosswalk indicator in front of White Hall.
5. No First Aid Kits made available.
6. I need to know the location of items in question 8. (2)
7. Better lighting is needed in parking lots at night. (4)
8. Updated 911 cards have not been distributed to all employees.
9. I appreciate the RAVE alert system.
10. Adjunct faculty, to my knowledge, receive no safety instructions.
11. I have the "emergency response" card posted, but the manual...?
12. Don't have the entry/exit arms up so students don't go in the out and take the parking spaces.
13. In the basement of Knutti - poor visibility - high levels of foot traffic - yet extremely secluded. It's hard to tell who's coming and going.
14. Knutti Hall - G6 Adjunct office is unsafe. Rest of area is now totally deserted. I am often alone there especially Monday night before/after my 6 pm class. Also, I don't know if I can safely leave my laptop.
15. AWESOME job with snow removal! Amazing!
16. Question 6 - I tend to use the "chain of command" i.e. inform my supervisor
17. Question 8 - I know we have a minor first aid box, band aids, etc. but body fluid clean up kits? - eludes me. Also, not sure if AEDs exist...where? Policy for use by layman? Also, consider publicizing "Hands free CPR"...fairly new concept for people who might have reservations re: providing such first aid.
18. A major concern remains the "Gunman Scenario" - notification system exists and procedures to follow.
19. Though the Facilities Management does a good job overall in snow removal, I do believe places that seem to remain open - even when campus is closed, such as the library...thus because of traffic (foot), should be a priority for shoveling of walks and de-icing same.
