Seasonal flu and H1N1 flu guidelines

The guidelines are outlined on the Human Resources Web site for employee and student absences due to seasonal flu or H1N1 flu (See Guidelines for Flu Illness at <http://www.shepherd.edu/hrweb/>).

Because the Center for Disease Control (CDC) is urging employers to modify absenteeism policies that discourage employees from complying with the recommendation to self-isolate if they contract the flu, Shepherd University has implemented a temporary modification of its sick leave policies with regard to documentation required for multiple days of absence due to illness. Please read the guidelines for further details.

Flu vaccine on campus

The regular flu vaccine is being offered to all employees and students. The vaccine will be available to students Tuesday, October 6 and Friday, October 9 from 9 to 11 a.m. and 1 to 3 p.m. The vaccine will be available to employees on Friday, October 16 and Tuesday, October 20 from 10 to 11:30 a.m. and 1:30 to 3 p.m. The charge is \$20, payable by cash, check, or Rambler. The fee is covered for all classified employees. Bring your Rambler card. Only people who are well will be able to receive the flu shot. The shots are on a first-come, first-served basis. The shots will be offered at these times only.

The Center for Disease Control (CDC) recommends getting the regular flu shot as early as possible, and that they are available now at local health departments and some pharmacies.

The Shepherd University Student Health Center will continue to offer clinics until the vaccine has been distributed.

Elevator and ADA rest rooms to be installed

Beginning on Monday, November 23, through Sunday, January 10, 2010, the Student Center elevator will not be available for use due to a complete replacement of all systems associated with new installation. This \$155,000 project will include major ADA and safety requirements to meet state and federally mandated laws and codes.

Wheelchair access to the ground floor will be through existing front entrance doors to bookstore, SGA, and Rambler card offices while access to the Ram's Den, Fireside Bistro, information center, and student affairs offices will be via the driveway and patio door entrance. The second and third floors will not be accessible during this period. Those offices affected may make arrangements to meet clients in the Rumsey Gallery during this time.

In addition, there will be upgrading to the third floor rest-rooms to meet current federal ADA standards during this same period. The Storer Ballroom will not be accessible during the same time frame because of both upgrades.
