About the Major

The Department of Economics and Finance at Shepherd University has five full-time faculty members, all of whom hold doctor's degrees in economics from major universities. The economics curriculum provides the student with **a firm grounding in economic theory and exposes students to a breadth of issues in the elective courses**. Students are also required to take a capstone course (Senior Seminar in Economics) during their senior year. In the capstone course students engage in directed independent research. The emphasis in this course is on a senior thesis that requires the student to select a topic and formulate a testable hypothesis, survey the relevant literature, collect data, and statistically test the stated hypothesis.

Careers

- The economics and finance discipline helps to prepare students for careers in either the **public or private sectors**.
- Economics majors find private sector jobs in the fields of banking, consulting, finance, insurance, management, marketing, and sales.
- A number of public sector agencies, including the Bureau of Labor Statistics, Congress, the Federal Reserve, the Federal Trade Commission, and the Department of State, hire students with an economics degree.
- A Shepherd University major or minor in economics is **excellent preparation for a student wishing to attend law school**. It will also prepare a student for **graduate studies in business, economics, international affairs, and public policy**.

Points of Pride

- A number of recent graduates with a major in economics are currently working as analysts for the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the Department of Energy, and the Brookings Institution.
- Recent graduates with a concentration in financial economics are working in the fields of finance and wealth management.
- A number of graduates with a major in economics have gone on to obtain graduate degrees in business administration, economics, and law.
